
*Who’s hand is just inches away from being grasp and pulled to safety ?*

## **EXHORT! EXHORT! EXHORT!**

**EXHORT! ....**This word, in various tenses, is used in the New Testament and means to help, encourage, lift up or spur on. In the book of Hebrews we are twice told to help one another to stay firm in the faith and to move forward spiritually. It also says to follow this practice while it is yet "Today" and to do it more earnestly as we see the Final Day drawing nearer.

We are told that this is important because it is easy to become hardened to the deceptiveness of sin. Like Christian in the ancient classic, Pilgrim's Progress, we can be distracted from the road to the Celestial City by such places as the Slough of Despond, Vanity Fair, Hill of Difficulty, By-Path Meadow or Doubting Castle.

In the Book of Acts, Barnabas is known as The Encourager and he demonstrates this in helping Paul as well as others. We also find this example when Eliphaz says to Job, "Your words have supported those who stumbled; you have strengthened faltering knees." All around us people are hurting or discouraged so there is a great need to **EXHORT! EXHORT! EXHORT!** However, we will be limited in encouraging or lifting up others unless we are encouraged and lifted up ourselves.

In I Samuel 30, we read that David encouraged himself in the Lord and found new strength which enabled him to lead his soldiers into battle. Make it a point every day to get a dose of inspiration from the Lord and His Word because there are those who are waiting for someone like you to show up and give them a boost in the form of a smile, a word of encouragement or a helping hand!

### *Let's Talk About the Goodies*

When I say 'Goodies' I am referring to T-shirts, backpatches, sweatshirts, etc. and what an easy way to witness. If you are wearing an MJM shirt folks will always have a comment to say to you and that opens the door to talk about Jesus. If you have worn your shirts and caps into restaurants, rest stops or shopping you know what I mean; they just start a conversation.

However, Goodies also include our new MJM brochure, Gospels of John, New Testaments and tracts. You need to carry some with you when a contact is made and share a 'word' in print. You should have a business card with your name and

Team name and your phone/email on it to leave with a person. These items are for the purpose of telling others about Jesus -- as in "go into all the world and preach the Good News"!

I am able to buy literature in bulk as much as I have the funds to do so. Go to a Christian book store and you will find our .85 Gospel of John priced at \$2.00 and the \$4.00 Christian Life New Testament is \$9.00. The book company and printer have bills/salaries to pay also and if I don't pay for what I order I would be cut off from ordering again, but most of all what would not paying do for my Christian witness?

I am saying this to say when you order MJM literature you must pay the prices indicated plus shipping for the Goodies to break even. The prices shown are MJM's cost. That means Goodies is not making any money, but just paying the bill. In the past many folks sent extra or simply sent a donation to the Goodies, but with the tight economy that has not been happening and others have not been covering the extra cost of those who don't pay the cost of items.

When you order literature and don't pay the cost of getting it it's called stealing. An ugly word, but what else can you call taking something you did not pay for--and then you say you are going to use it to witness for Jesus. What would Jesus call it?

**Prayer: "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." (Jeremiah 29:13)**

Prayer takes us in three directions: prayer takes us "inward" as we seek transformation in our lives; "upward" as we seek the intimacy with Jesus we desire; and "outward" as we minister to the needs of others. This month I want to complete the journey "inward" and explore the dimensions of prayer that have been referred to as the Prayer of Tears, Prayer of Relinquishment, Formation Prayer and Covenant Prayer.

*Penthos* is the Greek word that refers to a broken and contrite heart, inward godly sorrow, or prayerfully expressed tears. It is weeping over our sins and the sins in the world that surround us. Ultimately it is the recognition that our sins diminish the feeling of God's presence in our lives, though He is always fully present. Our human moments of discouragement and falling short of the Christian ideals; affects our sensitivity to God's presence and guidance in our lives. We give God access into our lives at an emotional level through our heartfelt tears

which opens our life to transformation. As the tax collector said in Jesus' parable "God, be merciful to me a sinner! (Luke 18:13), Christians today use the ancient liturgical refrain *Kyrie, Eleison* (Lord, have mercy). A petition for mercy means we have totally abandoned our life to the hands of God, leading to our most intimate moments with the Holy Spirit – the presence of Christ in life's journey.

The Prayer of Relinquishment, is the grace-filled releasing of our wills and desires to the things that we seek in our lives, whether they be personal goals or ministry goals. As Christians, I have felt for so long that He calls all of us "to the full time ministry." There were years in my life when a pastor or church leader would come up to me and share that "God called him to the full time ministry." I would give the person my puzzled look along with the statement "I thought God called everyone to the full time ministry – never thought we were to be part time Christians." I don't do that anymore. As the years have progressed and I have pursued numerous faith related goals including the chaplaincy, so often in failure. I have come to realize that so often ministry is not something pursued, but something that happens in the present moment when we have relinquished our vision of the future to allow us to become sensitive to the present moment and all the opportunities it offers for us to respond. Examples of relinquishment in the life of Christ include Gethsemane and the Cross. It is the *crucifixion of the will*, a letting go, hope for tomorrow and resurrection to new life.

Formation prayer is the "prayer that changes us" as we pray. *Conversatio morum* mean constant change, constant conversion and constant openness to the presence of God in our lives. Resurrection to new life follows death to the old self. The tears and "relinquishment" or letting go lays the foundation for change, being conformed to a life that is more "Christ like" in nature. Theologically that means being conformed to the image of the Son. As Richard Foster has said "we are a pilgrim people on a journey of faith." A classical approach to Formation Prayer is the pursuit of humility describe in *The Rule of St. Benedict*. Humility is to live as close to the truth as possible – truth about who we are as individuals, the truth about those around us, and the truth of the world in which we live. The root of the word humility from Latin is *humus* which means fertile ground. Formation in the image of the Son is rooted in humility – as we experience the life of going beyond ourselves to find joy in the simplest things in life and in the present moment – knowing that Christ

is present in the journey through life with us. Today lays the foundation for tomorrow. We must not focus so much on the future that we miss Christ by our side today.

Covenant Prayer guides us through the valley of sacred commitment where we promise holy obedience. Covenant is a Bible word where God entered into covenants with others that included individuals such as Noah, Abraham, Moses, and David. The stipulations of the covenant include the commandments of God, including the Ten Commandments. We covenant with God by promising to live obedient and faithful lives. Our covenant with God is a way of expressing our gratitude for God's mercy. We covenant time, place, and an open heart. Time as an expression of totally committing our lives to Christ, place as we seek community and Christian fellowship, and an open heart as we live; cultivating "holy expectancy" in the present moment.

Tears, relinquishment, and covenant; the basis for the intimacy we desire with Christ in our faith journey. As I shared in a previous month's article with you, I went through a crisis in my faith journey when all that I sought with the move to Kentucky including the chaplaincy ministry, didn't work out. All I sought to accomplish I failed at. For the first few years in Kentucky as I commuted to a new job outside of my field of work while I was seeking to rebuild a career, I would keep saying to myself as I drove to work "I am so sorry Jesus" (I felt I had been a total failure.). Prayer is intimacy with God. It was during those years of commuting approximately 2 hours round trip each day I progressed through the several steps or stages of prayer as I found a new sense of meaning in my life. I see life, not as a career, but a vocation or calling – a calling as a pilgrim on the journey of life, shared with Christ. I have learned, and am continuing to learn, that life is not so much about seeking change, as being changed as we find the intimacy with God we are seeking. It is looking forward to the future while living in the present. It is about experiencing the richness of the Christian life – and prayer is a wonderful avenue to grow in our intimacy with Christ.


## Two Sides of the Story
