We have great anticipations, as the weather is great compared to the blizzard of last year. There was a great crowd on Saturday. Many parents took pictures of their children on the "Monster Bike". There were several other "Biker Ministries" there also. Sunday was slower than expected. Paul, Easter, Braden and I enjoyed serving, but were ready for home when we got out of there at five.

February 28<sup>th</sup>, I mounted my trusty trike and headed to Daytona. I arrived on the 29<sup>th</sup> at about 1PM. It was 80+ degrees, better than the 36 degree starting temperature. Joe had a spot for us across from the Iron Horse Saloon, next to Booth Hill Saloon on Rt. 1 Ormond Beach. But Joe got hit by a car on his bike a couple weeks ago, and just got out of hospital last week. He was injured seriously. Keep Joe in your prayers, he has a lot of healing to go. Special thanks to Jim & family for putting some of up and receiving Bible shipments. We had a great time of fellowship, *servicing others and the Lord*. I continued to travel, on my Harley that I rode to Daytona, to Rick's in Kissimmee, St. Cloud, and Clearwater. Only to return to Ohio after 24 days of sun shining 80-90 degree weather, because I volunteered our Church to host the countywide Good Friday Noon Service. And my granddaughter's birthday was on the 25<sup>th</sup>, also.

*The Completed Jews Corner-*

Hi, my name is Robin Tamburino and I am a Jewish believer in Christ, which myself and others translate into a "completed Jew". A completed Jew, one who has accepted Yeshua (Jesus) as the Messiah! I hope and pray you will enjoy reading about the holidays (Yom Tovs) from a Jewish perspective. May you all be blessed!

### *Passover Time Again*

Passover is a holiday that has soooooo much symbolism and history that to go over it fully would take forever, and besides if I do things in pieces I have something to write each year.

So I thought that we could briefly go over the Seder plate and table, which sits center in the table and the items on it are so full of symbolism and significance.

- 1) First of all by the Seder plate is a bowl of salt water, which we will dip our vegetables that are on the Seder in. The salt water signifies the tears of the Hebrews throughout all the years of slavery in Egypt prior to the Exodus.
- 2) Z'roa (shank bone) - any bone with meat on it can be used. It represents the Paschal sacrifice (the sacrificial lamb which for us would be Yeshua)
- 3) Beitzah- (roasted Egg)- the egg is never explained in the seder so no one knows what it means. One theory is that it represents the Jewish people who like a hard boiled egg had to become tougher the longer they were "boiled" (put through hardships and repressed). Another theory is that it is there to raise questions, and a more modern theory is the representation of spring.
- 4) Karpas- (Green vegetable) Parsley is generally used but anything that grows from the ground may be used. This is a non-bitter root that alludes to the backbreaking work of the Hebrews as slaves.
- 5) Maror -(bitter herb) horseradish is generally used for this either fresh or bottled BUT you should use fresh as a vegetable. Bitter herbs remind us of the bitterness of the slavery of our forefathers in Egypt.
- 6) Chazeret- (another bitter herb-lettuce)- usually use romaine lettuce or endive. This is a symbol of the bitter enslavement of the Hebrews. Although the leaves are not bitter the stem when left to grow in the ground becomes hard and bitter.
- 7) Charoset- (apples, nuts, cinnamon and wine) represents the mortar the slaves in Egypt used in their construction.
- 8) Wine- requirement is to have 3.5 ounces on the table, which we drink half of those 4 times throughout the Seder. Grape juice can be substituted for children or those who do not drink alcohol.
- 9) Matzah- 3 pieces with a towel between each piece- centerpiece gets broken.

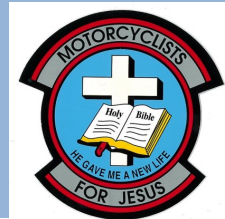
