Prayer: Experiencing the Guidance and Peace of Christ in Our Lives – Sacramental to Unceasing Prayer

“⁶Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. “⁸Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things.” [Philippians 4:6-8].

Prayer takes us in three directions: prayer takes us “inward” as we seek transformation in our lives; “upward” as we seek the intimacy with Jesus we desire; and “outward” as we minister to the needs of others. This month I want to continue the journey “upward” as we seek intimacy with Jesus through sacramental and unceasing prayers.

Sacramental Prayer is incarnational prayer. Sacramental prayer may not necessarily be liturgical in nature, but liturgies often are considered sacramental. Liturgical expressions of our faith help us to express what is on our hearts, often when we cannot adequately express verbally our most intimate and personal feelings in our relationship with Jesus. Liturgical Sacramental Prayer brings us into the “communion (with) of the saints.” Liturgical prayerful expressions keep us focused on God and the body of faithful believers we worship with rather than the individual congregational leader. Through liturgy we stay focus on the life of the faith community, rather than only focusing on our needs and also find new expressions of our faith beyond our own present point in the faith journey. Often we become too much at home – and need to be challenged in our growth as Christians. Liturgical expressions of faith free us to worship with our innermost being rather than thinking through how we might express our faith in words

we commonly use. Liturgy bring us profound expressions of faith that transcend the moment in history we are immersed.

When we think of prayer, the “Lord’s Prayer” often comes to mind. Examples of expression of prayer are also found in the Psalms. The Psalms are thought of as both a hymn book as well as including the prayers of David. Psalm 72:20 says “This concludes the prayers of David son of Jesse.” The important point to remember is that prayer is expressed in a multitude of ways. The many ways we can enter into prayer lead us to point where we can enter into “unceasing prayer” with our Creator.

Prayer unites the soul to God and provides the avenue for maintaining a constant relationship with Jesus. The objective of unceasing prayer is to live in continual conversation with our Creator. As Richard Foster says it is “keeping in constant touch with God, of making him the object of my thoughts and the companion of my conversations.” It is practicing the “presence of God.” “Pray without ceasing or pray continually” was taught by Paul in 1 Thessalonians 5:17. In Colossians 4:22 we are reminded to devote ourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. Continuous prayer in our lives can bring peace in the presence of daily living – with all its challenges. Another way the concept of continuous prayer has emerged in the Christian faith tradition is in the Eastern Christian hesychastic tradition and has been referred to as “breath prayer.” The most famous breath prayer is “Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.” I would like to challenge us to develop own “breath prayer” to help keep us focused on the presence of God in our lives. The concept of “breath prayer” is an expression we can say in one breath or sentence. In my life one that I use is “Jesus, thank you for being present my life and the lives of those I share each day with – asking that my actions in all situations reflect the life you desire for me to live.” A goal that we all strive for but all fall short of – but thankfully we have eternity with Jesus to develop the relationship we seek. Thomas Kelly has alluded to this concept by saying “Life from the Center is a life of unhurried peace and power.” I prefer to think of it as a life of peace and contentment in all of life’s circumstances. Our goal is for prayer to be integrated into the rhythm of our lives. It takes the presence of Jesus in our lives to one of “divine union.” Unceasing prayer is personal prayer, between us and God.

In closing, I am suggesting that as we read Christian literature, listen to prayers in worship, read expression of prayer found the Old and New Testaments of the Bible, we incorporate the structures of those prayers in our own prayer life. The Bible is our guide; this is a beautiful way to use it to develop a more personal relationship with God. As we recite or read these examples of prayer which often is a liturgical expression of prayer, our goal is to move from the liturgical or sacramental – to the spontaneous or unceasing expressions of prayer where it becomes very personal in our lives. The Bible is our life’s guide for all of us to follow. As we apply it in our lives, we personalize its message to our own unique journey in life.
