Mark your calendars. The 2023 spring kick off will be held June 9, 10, and 11 in Central PA. More details to follow.

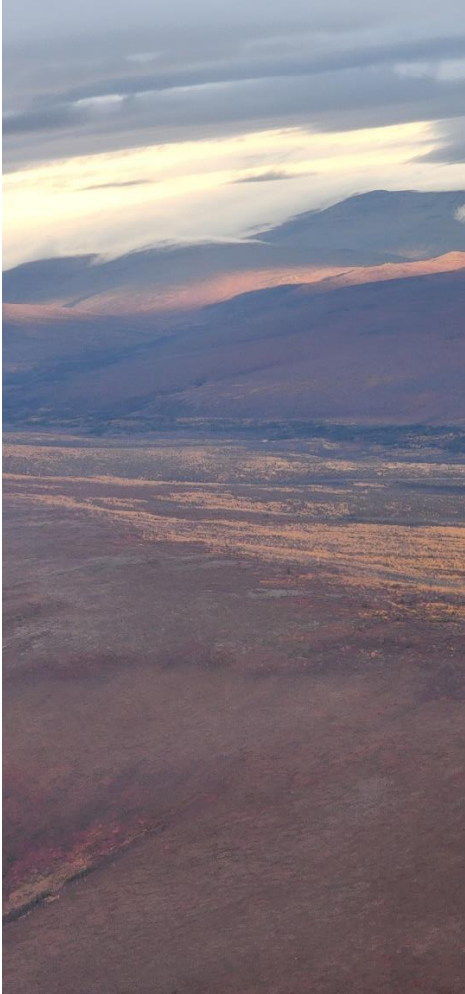
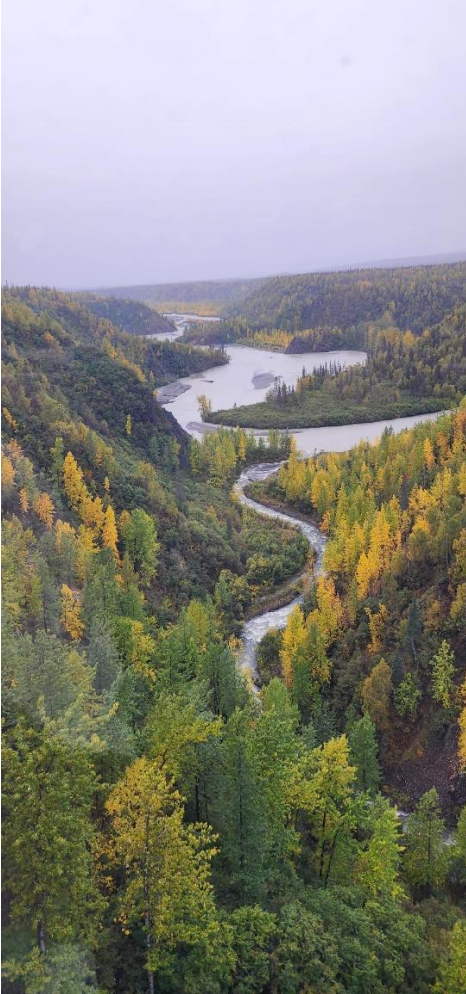
FROM THE EDITOR A TIME FOR EVERYTHING

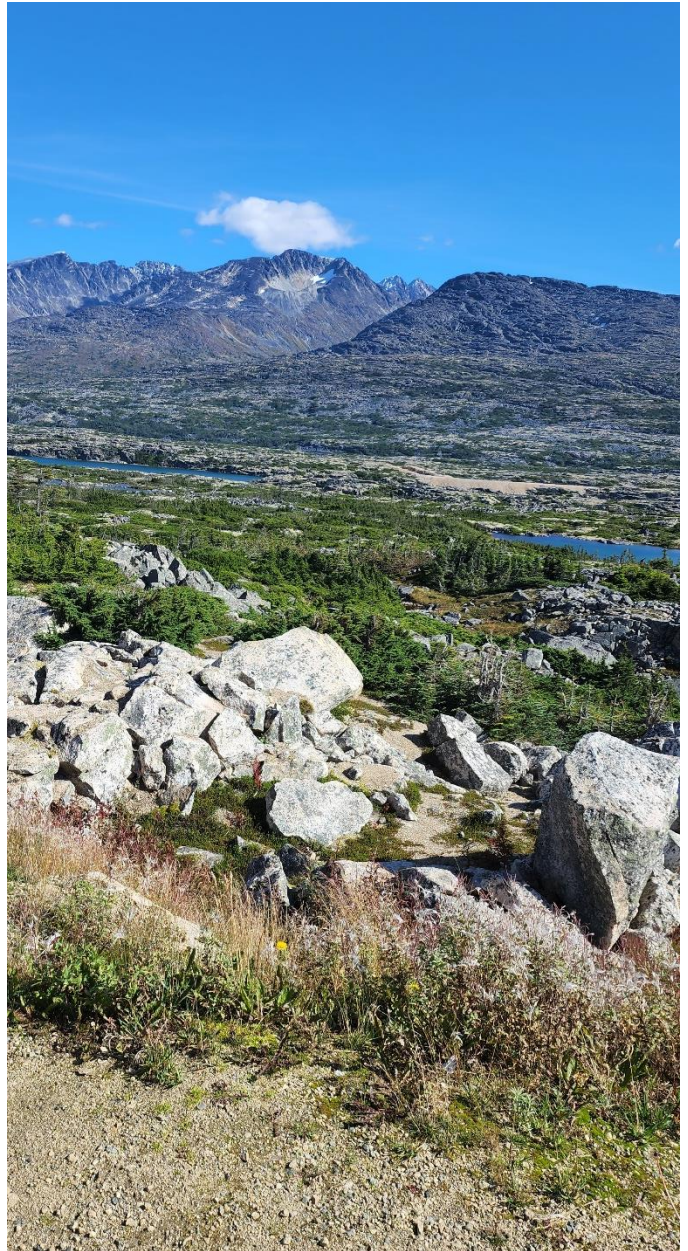
There is a time for everything,
