Last Friday morning as I wakened to the news of the shooting in Aurora, Colorado, my heart broke for the victims of this tragedy, their families, their community and our nation as a whole. Situations like this are evidence of humanity's brokenness and they often lead us to ask the question, "why?" In the hours and days following the shooting, we have been bombarded with reports and commentaries espousing a wide spectrum of views on why such a tragedy has happened and who is responsible.

Well-meaning people have been heard to say things like "It was part of God's plan" or "Everything happens for a reason." I must tell you that words like this make me bristle a bit. The God I know in Jesus Christ does not use natural disasters or human-caused massacres as a reward or punishment. I do believe that God is able to reach into the sin and death of situations like this to bring healing and life, but this is different than the engineering of a tragedy for a greater purpose. The God I serve and proclaim to the world does not desire or cause human suffering.

The media and our justice system continue to do their best to answer the question of "why" in the most literal sense. They will seek to uncover the shooter's motives and get a comprehensive understanding of the circumstances, but I suspect that even if we do get answers to these questions, it will not be enough.

In our deepest sense, the question of "why" is not really a request for a logical explanation as there is no logical explanation that can justify or make sense of the senseless. Rather, the question of "why" is more of an expression of grief, a cry of the heart that is as timeless as humanity itself. Expressions of grief are holy and necessary in times like this because as we work through our grief, we find hope. In the midst of such tragedy, we see hope in the kindness and compassion of people who rush to the scene to help. We see love and support from individuals and communities who gather to pray. In the end, the shooter does not have the last word.

Actually, none of us has the last word. That honor belongs to the indestructible love of God. For I am convinced that nothing – not a thing! – neither life nor death, no matter what its form; neither the past nor the future; neither governments nor those with power – nothing, absolutely nothing at all can separate us from God's love in Christ Jesus our Lord. (My own personal paraphrase of Romans 8: 38 – 39).

Have you ever felt that you were about to “miss the boat” or in the case of motorcyclists, miss a fantastic ride? Bob and I thought it might happen to us. This past Spring, while he was hospitalized, the Steel Ponies Exhibit opened at the Eiteljorg Museum of American Indians and Western Art here in Indianapolis. We finally got to see it just two days before the exhibit closed. The museum is always a joy to visit, resplendent with paintings and bronzes by Frederick Remington and Charles Russell and paintings by George Winter and Georgia O’Keefe. The Steel Ponies exhibit reached the zenith in combining must-see vintage, custom and “Hollywood” motorcycles, symbols of adventure and freedom, concepts often connected with the old west.

Troy Vargas, Lakota Choppers, incorporated hide, wood and stone in his custom bike. Another bike by Lakota Choppers called “the Great Spirit” featured a beautifully fabricated metal headdress around the fuel tank and dream catchers for wheels. Daniel Sanchez, an Apache and owner of Cut Throat Cycles, built a bike especially for the Steel Ponies exhibit. Then there was the bejeweled chopper, the “Art Attack.” In 2006 Russ Hess, Cowboy Customs, came out of twenty-one years of retirement to build this beauty imbedded with 115 gold flowers and rubies and forty-seven pieces of silver overlay. All I can say is, “WOW!” The show also featured the Captain America bike from Easy Rider, the bike Evel Knievel used to jump the fountain at Caesar’s Palace, and the bike Orange County Choppers built for the Chippewa Nation.

As we were leaving the museum, we paused to view a column featuring people’s

answers to some questions relating to the show. One person wrote, “I would take any bike that was free.” Another, looked like it was written by a child stated, “I’d like to ride to heaven to see Aunt Annie.”

Had Bob and I missed the exhibit, we would have been disappointed, but it certainly would not have been a disaster. However, reflecting upon those post-it notes on the column, I thought of King Agrippa’s words to Paul in Acts 26:28, “Almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian.” The gift of salvation is free to all who believe and it is my hope that the “child and Aunt Annie” both accepted this free gift and would have the joy of seeing each other again in glory.

I was reminded of the old hymn by P.P. Bliss:

*“Almost persuaded now to believe, Almost persuaded, Christ to receive,  
Seems now some soul to say,  
Go Spirit, Go Thy way, some more convenient day,  
on Thee I’ll call.”*

*MJM – A Ministry in the Footsteps of the Historical Jesus; One Faith; One Body; One Lord*

This month, I want to share what has been on my heart for a long time, and why MJM is special to me. We are “Motorcyclists for Jesus Ministries.” The MJM patch says we are motorcyclists for Jesus in ministry (acts of serving) the world in His name. We have a patch, not colors, for a patch shares where our heart is. Colors can be exclusive rather than inclusive – and Jesus extended His love and welcomed all to follow Him. We do not portray ourselves as an “association” for we are all called to be full time ministries where we have been placed to serve in life as individuals (“There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord” – 1 Corinthians 12:4-5). We each have a ministry. We form TEAMS with those special to us and we share life with as we ride and travel down the road of life we serve in a “group” that has...no paid officers and owns no property” – something Jesus would have identified with as we seek to identify with Him.

I am thankful our patch only has “Jesus” on it rather than Christian. Today when someone asks us what our faith is and we say we are a “Christian” I am concerned what message that may send to that individual and what his experiences of Christians and Christianity in general have been. I remember a co-worker approaching retirement I knew in recent years who was someone I truly admired regarding his values and work ethic. One day as we were talking about faith he shared with me – “the reason I am not a Christian, is that Christians as a whole are the ones who have treated me worst in life. Those words haunt me to this day. I use to say “I am a Christian” but today, I say I am a follower of Jesus. Over the years I have been associated with several Christian denominations, para-church ministries, along with doing an Internship and year-long Residency in the Chaplaincy (Clinical Pastoral Education). Between my membership in various Christian churches and the experience as a chaplain that placed me in touch with so many diverse faith groups and individuals (and their religious beliefs) – I have truly come to better understand how diverse those that refer to themselves as Christian are today and how diverse their ethical standards, lifestyles, and beliefs are. Does the church I attend today represent the ministry and work that Jesus started? I am 57 years old and the church has always been part of my life – and I am troubled by all the changes I have seen over the years in my lifetime. Things that were considered unacceptable when I was young are often considerable acceptable today. Dress, worship service format, lyrics to music and buildings have changed dramatically over the years. It is understandable that ministries change with changing needs in society – but should not what Jesus stands for in His ministry and life be unchanging in a rapidly changing world? As I grow as a Christian my focus is shifting from the church to the Jesus of history – the one who shares the journey of life with us today. When I see how much the church has changed in the 52 years of my life that I can clearly remember (when my mother gave me my first Bible around age 5) and today – I cannot but ask “how much has the church changed in over two thousand years when it has changed so much in the last several decades!” (By the way, I still treasure that Bible! I read from it when Jan and I were married as part of the service, December 12, 1998). If Jesus passed the churches around the world today, would He recognize that they were associated with the ministry he started over 2000 years ago?

My search for the Jesus of history and the Jesus of my faith and experience has led me to feel we have something very unique in MJM – a ministry that truly seeks to be patterned after the approach to ministry that Jesus pursued in the cultural setting of His time.

Beginning in about the seventeenth century a fateful change began to occur, a change that would result in a divergence between the claims of faith and creeds (doctrines of faith) published by the organized churches and those of the historical Jesus. The “historical Jesus quest” or the “Jesus movement to Christianity” as it has been called led scholars to conclude such points as the following:

- Jesus did not attempt to start a new church or organize a new faith in the Greco-Roman world, but instead sought to show a new way to live and respond to the challenges faced in life by one's current cultural setting. Jesus did not come as a founder of a new religion, and yet a new religion, Christianity, was founded in His name and memory.
- His followers in the years following His crucifixion and resurrection memorialized His life in the celebration of the culture into which Christianity emerged as a separate faith from Judaism. The Great Mother (Magna Mater) which originated in Turkey around 6000 BCE and included the major festival day March 25 (the spring equinox and, in later Christian tradition, the feast of the Annunciation to Mary regarding the birth of Jesus). It included *taurobolium* which was a kind of "baptism" in blood. Mithras, the Persian God, deified as "savior" of humanity which celebrated his birthday as December 25 (winter solstice, and Christmas in Christian tradition, the celebration of the birth of Jesus).
- *Synagoge* was the Greek word for "a gathering together" or "assembly" and may best be translated as a "congregation." Initially it had no reference to a building as such, but rather to the assembly itself – only much later would "synagogue" and "church" come to be used as distinctive terms incorporating the meaning of a "place" or building where congregations meet.
- We look to the Bible as guidance to the life Jesus desires for us to live and how to organize believers today. Scholars believe the Gospels were written in a considerably later period than Jesus himself. Neither Jesus nor his first disciples wrote anything that has survived history. The teaching of Jesus went from oral to written form, with the earliest being the Gospel of Mark. Important Christian writings and events include the following: birth of Jesus (before 4 BCE); death and resurrection of Jesus (between 26-29 CE); letters of Paul (50-60 CE); deaths of James, Peter, and Paul (60-64 CE); Gospel of Mark (69-75 CE); Gospel of Matthew (80-90 CE); death of John (96 CE); Gospel of Luke, Acts (90-100); Gospel of John (96 CE?).
- The name "Christianity" as a designation for the new life that Jesus taught did not exist until nearly a century after Jesus's death. In Acts 11:26 we are told: "It was in Antioch that the disciples were first called Christians." In Greek the word is *Christianoi*. The missionary Paul, who lived and worked in Antioch (Gal. 1:21-2:14), never uses the term; nor does it appear in any source, Christian or otherwise, prior to the time Acts was written. The derived name "Christianity" (*Christianismos*), as a designation for the religion itself, does not appear before about 112-115.
- Paul catapulted the Jesus movement to a new level by his mission to non-Jews. Jesus himself was Jewish and the earliest movement retained its basic Jewish identity for some time before becoming a separate religion. Jesus's brother James was the central figure in Jerusalem until about 62 CE when revolutionary sentiment contributed to his arrest and death. James was the central figure in Jerusalem along with Peter (Cephas) and John (Gal 1:18-19; 2:9). Paul saw the Jerusalem group's primary responsibility as preaching to other Jews (Gal 2:8, 13). Paul was not the "first Christian." Paul never used the term "Christian." Instead, he clearly saw himself as a pious Jew who had been called on by God, through Jesus, to take this new message to non-Jews. Paul must be seen as part of the sectarian diversity of the Jesus movement that gave it vitality and opened new horizons as Jesus's teaching were taught to wider audience beyond Judaism. Scholars prefer to define Paul's experience of the spiritual Jesus as a "calling" rather than a conversion.

- The Gospels tell us that Jesus had four brothers and two sisters. He was baptized by his relative John. Jesus began preaching in Galilee and challenged the Roman authorities and their Jewish collaborators in Jerusalem. Among the twelve he chose to serve with Him included his four brothers. John (the Baptist), James (brother of Jesus) and Jesus himself were faithful Jews. Paul transformed Jesus and His message through his ministry to the Gentiles. Paul preached a message based on his own revelations which would become Christianity.

I have only highlighted a few items published by history scholars. One may ask, what does this have to do with MJM today?

I feel as MJM we are in a unique position that includes the following reasons:

- Our focus is on Jesus, his teachings, life, and example of how to conduct ministry in the cultural setting that one lives. This means recognizing that the Bible not only includes the teaching of Jesus, but how His followers sought to organize and expressed their faith in the years following Jesus's crucifixion and resurrection.
- Our focus is on Jesus, not any particular expression of it as the world sees the ministry of Jesus as it is taught or organized today in our present culture.
- As a ministry our focus is on the teachings and life of Jesus, not on the trends and practices of today's society – or seeking to incorporate current culture into MJM practices and activities.
- We are a ministry with no paid officers and own no property which follows the pattern of the work of Jesus. How better to make an impression to a non-follower or non-believer of Jesus than sharing his teachings and the difference He has made in our lives when it is given from the heart, expected nothing in return.
- We need to see our lives as a “calling” rather than focus on “conversion” where the journey shared with Jesus has only begun.
- The life as a follower of Jesus is one of continued revelation and direction through the ministry of the Holy Spirit.
- We seek to serve as individuals, with family members and others we meet and get to know, just as Jesus did with the example of his life of service and those he surrounded himself with.

In all the challenges we face in the world today, on planet Earth, which was created by God to be our present home – I am thankful for MJM.

In MJM with its focus on Jesus, I find the hope and courage to face tomorrow. As we focus on Jesus the head of our ministry, His teachings that provide the understanding and principles we seek to follow, the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit, and our Bible that shares not only what Jesus taught, but shows us how to make a difference in the world today and the lives of others.

Thank you all for MJM – I feel blessed to be associated with its ministry.
